HUNGER HEROES/FAREWAY FOOD DRIVE HELPS STOCK OUR PANTRY

Generous Fareway grocery shoppers bought a few extra items and donated them to the Center For Siouxland pantry at the Hunger Heroes' annual Fareway Food Drive held on October 7th and 8th at all four local Fareway stores. On that Friday afternoon and Saturday morning a total of 3,208 food items were donated. Cash contributions totaling \$107 were also made to our pantry program which helps assure that low-income families have enough to eat.

The USDA identifies one out of every eight Siouxland families as "food insecure". This means that these families experience real hunger and deprivation. Many literally don't know where their next meal is coming from.

A big thank-you goes out to Fareway stores, our Hunger Heroes committee, staff, volunteers, and especially the shoppers who cared enough to share food and donations with Siouxland families who really need the help!



COLLABORATIVE PROJECT HELPS PUT FAMILIES IN THEIR FIRST HOME

Although owning a home is a major element of the American Dream, rates of home ownership have declined in recent years. lowa ranks fourth nationally in home ownership rates. However, lowa's rate for home ownership in the last fiscal quarter was 70.1% -- a reduction of 6.3% over the past five years.

Center For Siouxland is partnering with the City of Sioux City to address this trend. Our MyPad collaboration provides first time home buyers with housing counseling and access to \$5000 or \$10,000 in down payment assistance.

So far this year, 28 households have completed all the housing counseling requirements to qualify for MyPad down payment assistance.

Our next pre-purchase home buyer class is scheduled for December 9th, and the next post-purchase class will be held on November 18th.
